The District wishes to thank Brian and recognise his outstanding service to Scouting and the Richmondshire District. We are creating the post of Honorary President and hope to elect Brian to that role at the AGM.

Like every other aspect of our lives Coronavirus has affected Scouting in many ways and stopped many of our regular meetings and activities. However, in true Scouting fashion, we have responded, Nationally, at County and District level.
